1 Safety Instructions

The JX2-PS1 module is in line with the current state of the art. The JX2-PS1 module complies with the safety regulations and standards in effect. Special emphasis was given to the safety of the users.

Of course, the following regulations apply to the user:

- relevant accident prevention regulations;
- · accepted safety rules;
- EC guidelines and other country-specific regulations.

Usage as Agreed Upon

Usage as agreed upon includes operation in accordance with the operating instructions.

The JX2-PS1 module is used to control machinery, such as conveyors, production machines, and handling machines.

The supply voltage of the JX2-PS1 module is DC 24 V . This operating voltage is classified as SELV (Safety Extra Low Voltage). The JX2-PS1 module is therefore not subject to the EU Low Voltage Directive.

The JX2-PS1 module may only be operated within the limits of the stated data.

Usage Other Than Agreed Upon

The JX2-PS1 module must not be used in technical systems which to a high degree have to be fail-save, e.g. ropeways and aeroplanes.l

If the JX2-PS1 module is to be run under surrounding conditions, which differ from the conditions mentioned in chapter 3: "Operating Parameters" on page 13, the manufacturer is to be contacted beforehand.

Who is Permitted to Operate the JX2-PS1 Module?

Only instructed, trained and authorised persons are permitted to operate the JX2-PS1 module.

Mounting and backfitting may only be carried out by specially trained personnel, as specific know-how will be required.

Maintaining the JX2-PS1 Module

The JX2-PS1 module is maintenance-free. Therefore, for the operation of the module no inspection or maintenance are required.

Decommissioning and Disposal of the JX2-PS1 Module



Dismantled protective equipment must be reattached prior to commissioning and checked for proper functioning.


Modifications and Alterations to the Module



For any damages resulting from the use of non original parts and equipment any claims with respect to liability of Jetter AG are excluded.



1.2 Instructions on EMI

The noise immunity of a system corresponds to the weakest component of the system. For this reason, correct wiring and shielding of the cables is important.



Important!

Measures for increasing immunity to interference:

- On principle, physical separation should be maintained between signal and voltage lines.
- Shield both sides of the cable.
- The entire shield must be drawn behind the isolation, and then be clamped under an earthed strain relief with the greatest possible surface area.

When male connectors are used:




Fig. 1: Shielding of SUB-D connectors in conformity with the EMC standards.

Only use metallised connectors, e.g. SUB-D with metallised housing. Please take care of direct connection of the strain relief with the housing here as well (refer to Fig. 1).




Fig. 2: Front View - JX2-PS1




Fig. 3: Side View - JX2-PS1




Fig. 4: Top View - JX2-PS1

5 Power Supply Module JX2-PS1

Power supply units are to supply decentralized non-intelligent expansion modules. They convert 24 V into a logic voltage of 5 V. The power supply unit is supplied with a voltage of 24 V via two terminals. A maximum of five non-intelligent expansion modules can be connected to one power supply unit.

Note!

Merely digital and analog input and output modules, as well as the JX2-CNT1 module are supplied by the power supply modules JX2-PS1 or JX2-PS1CP. Intelligent modules, such as SV, DIMA, PID etc., have got their own 24 volt power supply unit.




Fig. 5: Connections of the JX2-PS1 Module

For the incoming JX2 system bus a SUB-D connector (male) and for the outgoing system bus a 9-pin SUB-D connector (female) are available.



Important!

The FESTO CP modules have to be connected in series at the end of the system bus. FESTO CP modules do not enable automatic termination of the bus. This must be done manually. Junctions of the bus must be avoided. If the modules are arranged in a different way, the system will exhibit errors or won't work at all.




Fig. 6: Connections of the JX2-PS1 CP Module
